

Who Needs Coaching???

"Everyone needs a coach"...that's a bold statement! Everyone? Well, if you are someone who believes that God has created you for His purpose and your desire is to move forward and complete God's plan and goals for your life, then a Christian coach can help you get there. Why is a coaching relationship so important to achievement?

The term "coach" comes from the transportation era of stagecoaches and rail coaches in which the "coach" literally transported a person from one place to another. In today's context, a coach is a person who initiates an ongoing conversation that benefits the other person and moves them forward through discovery, learning, and creating a doable action plan.

I like Robert E. Logan's definition of coaching: "Coaching is the process of coming alongside a person or team to help them discover God's agenda for their life and ministry, and then cooperating with the Holy Spirit to see that agenda become a reality." Logan's definition of coaching not only reflects the core values of a good coach but also the intrinsic value of having a coach:

- 1. A coach comes alongside you...not behind to push nor ahead to lead...and is an encouraging and supportive partner.
- 2. A coach will ask powerful questions to evoke insight, discovery, and understanding into what God is doing in vour life.
- 3. A coach's concern is for your welfare, your mission, your agenda, and your goals.

Compass Spring Quarter to Focus on Christ

The spring quarter of Compass adult Sunday school literature will be entitled What We Believe: Jesus. Written by the late Dr. E. Harold Henderson, these lessons on the doctrine of Christ will challenge and inspire participants throughout March, April, and May of 2015.

After Christ's resurrection from the dead, two apostles traveled along the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13). As they walked, Jesus drew near and walked alongside them. Interestingly, the two apostles did not recognize Christ (v. 16).

In the midst of their conversation, Jesus revealed His identity to the apostles through scriptures. Luke 24:27 states, "And beginning at Moses and all the prophets, he expounded unto them in all the scriptures the things concerning himself."

All Scripture points to Christ! Jesus is the focal point of the entire Bible from beginning to end.

Gay Marriage - Deviant Selfishness

Homosexuals possess U.S. Constitutional rights identical to those that everyone else in America enjoys. They are free to be gay. Gays mistakenly believe that basic human rights and our U.S. societal-norms guarantee them the right to marry as in a traditional marriage of man and woman. Yet centuries of human rights' definitions have never included same-sex marriage.

There is no way to sugarcoat the reality of the core of immoral, selfish homosexuality, especially the male sexual relations, it is as ugly as anything can get. God's relevant Word states in Romans 1:24 "God gave them up to uncleanness through the lusts of their own hearts, to dishonor their own bodies between themselves."

Many of this day attempt cover-ups such as "they are nice people," or "they have loyal commitments," but gays are tearing apart the moral fabric of our American nation, and they are attempting to rid our society of allegiance to God's Word and His marriage precepts. Paul said in Romans 1:28..."they did not like to retain God in their knowledge..." So how do Christian moralists consider the "gay world" selfish?

1. Gay and Abortionists believe in a Zero Population position. Surprisingly, very few have spoken of or written of the selfish intent of these to never increase the population. In Genesis 1:28 God told Adam and Eve "Be fruitful and multiply and replenish the earth..." Gays, lesbians, and avowed abortionists in living their way would never populate the world as God in-

2. Gays' selfishness leads others astray as they assess those who oppose homosexuality. They want all to believe it is just "old-timers" and fanatical Christians who hate their lifestyle. But the people of many states have voted against gay marriage. In spite of the U.S. Justice courts overruling these states and outlawing the Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA) does not mean that the American people are in favor of perversion in marriage. Of the 313,914,000 Americans that populate our nation, only 1.7% are gay and only 1.8% are bisexual, according to Wikipedia and the 2010 census. In the first large-scale government survey measuring Americans sexual orientation, the N.H.I.S. (National Health Interview Survey) reported in July 2014 that 1.6 percent of Americans identify themselves as gay or lesbian.

3. Gays' selfishness closes their eyes to the overall health of American society. Again in Paul's admonition of Romans 1:27..."men leaving the natural use of the woman, burned in their lust....working that which is unseemly. and receiving in themselves that recompense of their error which was meet." Historically, civilizations like Babylon, the Mayans, Greece, and Rome crumbled from within their own culture via sexual perversion. Many in our nation seemingly have no regard for what gay life will ultimately cost their soul or what corrosion it will inflict upon society around them. Gays, lesbians, bisexuals, and transgender are selling their health and their soul for short moments of deviant physical pleasure.

4. Gays' selfishness continually and viciously disparages any references in the Bible that condemns their open sin. L.B.G.T. shamelessly discounts the concept

that the Bible is the moral standard of living, or if they do accept the Bible verses, they misconstrue them to fit their lifestyle of sin. They prefer no moral standards, which is so dangerous for any society. They argue that Jesus Christ is all about love and complete acceptance. Romans 1:22 says..."Professing themselves to be wise, they became fools." Jesus does love all people, including gays, but He notes the sin and offers forgiveness and healing if it is desired.

In conclusion, this deviant selfishness springs from an immoral mind and heart that leads to an erroneous conviction that the gay life is OK. Lesbianism produces a gross picture of a woman on woman and two gay males engaging in sex is a quantum leap from anything beautiful or moral in marriage.

Homosexuality has been classified as deviate and criminal by the majority of the world's population for thousands of years, but now in the last 40-50 years, powerful people are attempting to reverse that standard with brainwashing techniques via our children, the media, and by liberal judges and liberal churches

To love and be loved with the warmth and intimacy of a Godly marriage is a beautiful thing. But to accept the gay concept of marriage is a serious distortion of acceptable conduct. Romans 1:32 "who knowing the judgment of God..." as you read God's Word may it speak clearly: - Leviticus 18:22, Leviticus 20:13, Mark 10:6-9, I Corinthians 6:9-12, and Jude 7-8.

Last month I pointed out that our operating funds were almost depleated and that we needed some special offerings or increased monthly giving. Thanks to a few churches who have already responded, but we must have more long-term response soon.

A Challenge to the Meramec Association

I'm sitting here on Wednesday night at one of the most beautiful evenings that I've ever seen at Jesus Camp at the Meramec Retreat Center. We had a good crowd; however it is small. I'm sitting here wondering aloud that out of 20 churches why is this tabernacle not full on Wednesday night? This campus is within 20 to 40 minutes of most of our churches.

About 5 years ago I had the idea to challenge our churches to have a Camp attendance sign-up by March, challenging each member and attendee to pick a night to attend. If you want to pick all the same night for your church, that's great. Or, if you have folks that want to come different nights whatever the case may be.

As the Pastor of Bethel Baptist Church and the Chairman of the Camp Committee, I'm asking every church to participate in the Meramec Association Jesus Camp and by March that you put a sign-up sheet. I'm challenging the Pastors to challenge your members and attendees to pick a night and come. The goal is to get as many folks of your membership here that you can.

So now, a test question: "Do I have to convince anyone in this association that America needs revival? If so, then I'll love you enough to tell you that you have your head firmly in the sand. We are a broken nation. We are a dying nation, and as a result, we are a suffering nation. I don't believe our kids are the problem. I believe Christians refusing to sell out to the Great Commission is.

I know that our churches are full of people that are sold out today to the Commission, so I'm asking you to be the change that you want to see in our youth and here is an opportunity to do just that.

One of the things that is wrong with Christianity in America is a refusal to join in where you see God working. We had 13 saved at Kid Camp. God is working! Please come. Bring your kids and grand kids, or send hem and then come in the evening and see what God has done on that day.

This association has somewhere in the neighborhood of \$500,000 invested. We should not only support because of finances. We should support this Camp because of the commitment to Christ. Our goal is to reach lost men, women, boys, and girls.

I was told as a young lad that the reason that we are part of an association is because we can do together more than what we can do alone, so I'm asking you to come together and let's do more.

Those words were spoken into my phone over 6 months ago. You may notice it is not the most eloquent letter you have ever heard, but I hope you hear the passion and desperation that we all should feel about the condition of our nation.

In those 6 months we have seen a government cast off the Constitution in her dealings. Many of our states that voted to uphold the scriptural definition of marriage as being between a man and a woman have seen that vote overturned. Ferguson has happened. A minister has been told that if he does not solemnize marriages between homosexuals he will face jail time. The Houston Mayor subpoenaed the sermons of Houston Churches because of their stand against a policy she was supporting that furthered the LBGT agenda (she has since dropped it). Hello, my name is Makay-la Sanders. Bro. Ben asked me to write this letter to you. We were talking during 'The Beast' challenge at camp last year about how many people in our association could and should run 'The Beast.' Then we got onto health, so I just want to share these thoughts with you in light of that conversation.

Do you think it is a sin to be overweight? Why would it be? "It is not hurting anyone" is what most people think. Adults, I hear it all the time from quite honestly, I believe, preachers that are tired of talking to disinterested adults. Those preachers say that they believe the next revival is going to come from the youth and that most, if not all great revivals have come from the youth. I'm not trying to argue against history as much as tell you that I don't believe that is God's design. According to Scripture, it's the adults that are to set the example. It's the adults that are to lead.

So, I'm challenging myself and the Meramec Association to: #1 Pick at least one night to come to camp worship and be there by 6:30 p.m. #2 If you're overweight, accept the challenge and let's get in shape. #3 If you are able, take the challenge of the obstacle course that we call 'The Beast' and let's have some fun. #4 and greatest of all, let's individually daily pray for revival in America and please end your prayer with "Lord, start with me."

LifeWord Turns Fifty

"Surely, we have only to read the front pages of our newspaper or hear the newscasts to know that our nation is in crisis times, and we feel that the greatest help that we could give our own America is the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ. Until men know Jesus in an intimate way by receiving Him as Personal Saviour and being transformed by His grace, we cannot expect to see civil justice. The thirty-minute broadcast was over radio station KSTL 630 "on the dial in St. Louis, Missouri," and within a month, a Kansas City broadcast had begun. In a letter to the Gleaner, Bro Morris thanked Trinity Baptist Church in Florissant, Missouri; their pastor Ashford Conrad; the Cane Creek Association; and W.H. Newman of Chambers Park Baptist Church in St. Louis "for their liberal support for this program." In November of 1965 Bro. Morris named his program The Harvest Gleaner Gospel Hour.

From two radio broadcasts in English to forty-eight different formats, thirty-four languages and 110 countries, Lifeword has continued to obey that Great Commission calling. We are celebrating this anniversary by also thanking churches and individuals who have made this unique media ministry possible.

Franklin Graham: Quran Teaches Acts Of Islamic Terrorism

(OneNewsNow.com) - Christian evangelist Rev. Franklin Graham has explained why he blasted Duke University's recent accommodation of Islam and marginalization of Christianity.

Graham was pleased that Duke reversed its decision permitting a Muslim prayer event in the campus' Christian chapel, but said that he is fed up with there being more support in the U.S. for a minority religion whose majority of adherents seek to destroy the very faith upon which America was founded. Even though Duke ended up deciding to cease its policy that set up an Islamic call to prayer at the Christian chapel located on campus, Graham called out university officials and other government entities for going out of their way to accommodate Islam while pushing Christianity to the wayside.

"I agree with diversity, but what's happening with this country is all these religions are getting front row and Christians are being pushed — and we're the majority — are being pushed back to the back of the room," Billy Graham Evangelistic Association President and CEO Franklin Graham declared in a recent interview on WNCN News.

Just over a week ago, Graham unloaded his sentiments aimed at Duke officials after they announced the university would be holding a Muslim call to prayer inside the school's Christian house of worship. After receiving much heat over the decision, school officials announced that they reversed their decision so that the chapel will no longer be used to host the Islamic event.

U.S. abandoning its Christian roots to embrace Islam? Graham says he simply doesn't understand how a nation can turn its back on the religious backbone of its society and bend over backwards to honor and make concessions for the very religion that declares it the Great Satan and its mortal enemy.

"This country was built with Christian principles — it was men and women who believed in God and believed in His Son, Jesus Christ, who built this country," Graham articulated. "We're the greatest nation in the history of the world. It wasn't built by Islam, and it wasn't built by any other group; it

was those who supported and believed in the Lord Jesus Christ."

Graham, the son of the iconic world evangelist Billy Graham, insists that religions other than Christianity are getting preferential treatment in the name of tolerance or multiculturalism. He went on to express that the previous policy instituted by Duke officials ushering a call for Muslims to pray in a Christian chapel is inconceivable. The reverend insists that America needs to embrace the biblical principles established by God and its Christian forefathers, implying that America's fate as a nation will suffer if it keeps administering its anti-Christian and pro-Muslim policies.

Conceding that not every practice instituted by the founders of the United States was commendable, Graham argues that this is no reason to abandon the underlying Christian tenets upon which the U.S. Constitution and modern legal system was based. He says that America's traditions, history and governing principles must be fought for and protected so that they don't succumb to politically correct policies and pressures from activists
