Global Prayer:

Lifeblood of LifeWord

Leading up to LifeWord's Fiftieth Anniversary, Donny (Parish, BMA Productions Chief Creative Officer) and I talked quite a bit about a way to honor our unique media ministry, those whom God has used to spread the gospel through it, and the countless supporters during these fifty years. The goal was a lofty one, and we wanted to do it well.

September 4, 1965. Leading up to that date, there were prayers sent up by many faithful people. At first by two men, Harold Morris and Ashford Conrad, then by pastors and members of the following Missouri churches: Trinity in Florissant, the Cane Creek Association, Chambers Park in St. Louis, and Thirty-First Street in Kansas City, all of whom gave generously to the radio ministry along with their prayers.

In fact, Harold Morris's first short article about the new St. Louis radio broadcast mentioned the word prayer four times. He wrote, “We are truly convinced that by the radio we can not

only reach and challenge our churches to a great worldwide missionary endeavor, but that we can also effectively reach many in our nation with the saving grace of the Lord Jesus Christ. As you read this article, if you share with me this conviction, I would appreciate ... your prayers and support for this endeavor.” A man with great vision and conviction, he knew that prayer support was critical.

So a Global Prayer Meeting seemed to be the most appropriate way to honor the prayers of so many and thank God for his blessings. Prayer has been and always will be the lifeblood of Harvest Gleaner Hour/LifeWord.

September 4, 2015. One hundred people worldwide and fifty people at the BMA Global Ministry Center watched the Fiftieth Anniversary video and heard the prayers of Executive Director Steve Crawley, former Executive Director George Reddin and Paul Bearfield, Jr., son of former Director Paul Bearfield. The Expert??

I was intrigued by an ad I read this past week. The ad was about a conference and/or seminar with the title (changed to protect the innocent and me) "Secrets to the Powerful Life That You Can Get Only at This Meeting." The leader was a person who billed herself as (again titles and designations changed) something like "an expert in Christian living and miraculously empowered spiritual life coach." The ad went on to give the contact points for reservations, tickets, and how to have your group represented and empowered at this gathering. Wow! Who wouldn't want to sit at the feet of this expert? Who wouldn't want to get all in one swoop the total secrets of historic and contemporary Christianity? I hope all the pastors from my area will sign up, and I hope all the Sunday School teachers in the county will be on the front row. I know I would be there except for my imperative and unalterable appointment at the barber shop to have my eyebrows trimmed.

Perhaps I have misunderstood how to become a Christian. I thought that one came to know Christ, or better came to be known by Christ, with repentance and faith. I was convinced through the Word of God and the Holy Spirit that my life was on the road to ruin. I asked Christ to save me-make me His. He did at that time and place. He did this through His death, burial, and resurrection. He provides me with His Holy Spirit as teacher, guide, comforter, and intercessor in the very presence of God.

After reading the advertisement again, I really don't think I have misunderstood how to become a Christian, the Scriptures, or the Church and its mission. Come to think of it, I wish the spiritual expert well, but I don't think I will be enrolling in the gathering this week. There is no "expert" to give me the "secrets" of historic and contemporary Christianity other than the mainstays of the Spirit of God, the Scriptures, and the Lord's people gathered in His Church. CBC Breaks Enrollment Record for Fall 2015

Central Baptist College's enrollment reached the 881 mark for fall 2015 according to a report released by the Office of the Registrar. The overall enrollment breaks the institution's record of 858 in the fall of 2014 with a 2.68% increase.

The 881 mark includes 482 traditional students, an increase of 4.55% from the fall 2014 count of 461. The 482 includes 243 student athletes – which is the largest in the history of CBC.

CBC's Professional Adult College Education program saw a record 70 incoming students this fall and retention reaching 92% from the spring 2015 to the fall 2015. CBC's Online degree program increased 18.42%.

"Some of our newer programs such as Education, Worship Arts, and Kinesiology are gaining a lot of attention from students and prospective students," said CBC President Terry Kimbrow. "The word is spreading about our excellent academic programs and commitment to transforming lives."

Another area of growth is the expansion of CBC to offer classes on the campus of Champion Christian College in Hot Springs, Ark. CBC is currently offering traditional classes at that location and will be offering PACE classes starting November 2.

"I am extremely proud of all of our registration departments for their hard work and dedication to meet the institution's all time enrollment record," said CBC President Terry Kimbrow, "and we are already looking to fall 2016."

In a world that becomes more diverse and more global each day, Christian believers must face the toughest of questions from the existence of hell, to the evil of evolution, to the common objection of Christianity, and especially the moral lifestyle of born again believers. God's people cannot remain silent of Bible truths. "**Silence no more**" is the Moral Action outcry.

Jude 3 sounded out the alarm: "*Beloved, when I gave all diligence to write unto you of the common salvation, it was needful for me to write unto you, and exhort you that ye should earnestly contend for the faith which was once delivered unto the saints.*" The words "earnestly contend" mean to give a determined, intense struggle to defeat the foe. God wants us to valiantly strive for the faith. Born again Christians are to defend Bible-living styles. Our morals have to be upheld and lived by joyfully.

Simon Peter in I Peter 3:15 gave a command also, "*But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear.*" A ready answer is needed to share why we morally live as we do! A good verbal defense refuting the claims of the destructive critic is needed.

in school/college academics. We call it the dumbing down of American children. When discipline deteriorates, learning also deteriorates. Teachers are not able to teach if they do not have the attention of the children. Romans 1:31 declares they will be "without understanding".

Silence no more, as God's churches refute total sexual freedom. Humanists want to "liberate" our children from sexual inhibitions. Often their sex education programs are nothing more than academic pornography. To combat this humanistic philosophy, children need to be trained from the Bible in church, in school, and in the home.

They will be okay even when you mess up from time to time. If you are providing food, shelter, clothing, love, communication, and teaching them the ways of the Lord- you are doing your job. You don't have to do it perfectly. You have a full time paid child and adolescent counselor who will come day or night to your home. He is called the Holy Spirit. He is a wonderful counselor. Ask Him when you don't know what to do with your kids. I think we don't spend enough time before the Lord. Instead we just fret and worry. You are not a failure. You are part of a royal family and so are your kids. Hang in there and know God is on your side. **Grace really is sufficient.**

One Key to Helping Your Church Avoid the Disease of Institutionalization

When missionaries are commissioned to plant churches, they are expected to reach the communities to which they have been sent. For instance, a missionary sent to a suburb of Omaha, Nebraska, is expected to reach the people in that particular area through community engagement. Many times this takes shape as a service project such as handing out water bottles at a county fair to meet people or volunteering to feed the volunteer fire department in order to build relationships.

So when does it stop? When does a new church reach the point that it no longer needs to emphasize community involvement? Of course, the answer is **NEVER!**

Why, then, do many churches neglect community outreach? Perhaps it happens when a congregation loses focus on its mission and becomes institutionalized. Institutionalization occurs when the mission changes from an outward focus to an inward focus. Every church struggles with the temptation to institutionalize. Let's face it: reaching out means sacrificing time and resources that would otherwise be self-serving. Every decision within the church, therefore, must be made with intentional focus on the mission. Will the new budget reflect an emphasis on projects that enhance the church's comfort or projects that reach the community with the gospel? Will the next VBS be focused on ministering to "church kids" or will efforts be made to invite unchurched children? Is the next sermon series going to make us comfortable with our "holy huddle" or challenge us to share the gospel with our neighbors?

As long as there are unbelievers in the vicinity, the church must make efforts to engage the community. The Great Commission demands no less. So how will your church get involved? Let me challenge you to find at least one way to reach outside the walls of your church for the sake of making a kingdom investment. What will be your community mission?

Greetings from the Philippines. We have been on the field for 2 1/2 months, and it has been an exciting time. At the end of July, the new digital press was installed at the Publications office. I was anxious to begin training on the press and ready to start printing. After a couple weeks of training, we began printing the new Sunday School quarterly, as well as some tracts in English. That literature has already been delivered to the churches here on the islands of Negros and Mindanao. Our church in Hong Kong has also received some of the new literature as well.

The digital press takes so many of the old procedures out of the process, which allows us to produce materials quickly and efficiently. This simplification of the process gives us the ability and time to print a lot more than we could previously. I can't wait to begin printing even more literature in the many languages of Asia.

This new way of printing also helps when we begin to re-print material. Printing the old way, when you ran out of materials, you had to expend so much time and effort into the same steps just to produce the material again. With a digital press, we simply push a button and the job is immediately reprinted.

Since we began printing, we have produced 2 Sunday School quarterlies (we already have our 1st quarter of 2016 ready), along with 5 other booklets in English. We have produced 3 tracts in English, 2 in Ilonggo, 1 in Cebuano and another tract in Vietnamese. I also have a tract translated into Chinese, that I am waiting on the translator to assist me with the layout to ensure it is correct. We also have several other

Is Discipleship a Starting Line or a Finish Line?

Many times, people involved in planned discipleship think of it as a finish line: If the person being disciplined can just complete a discipleship program, he or she will cross a spiritual finish line to a place of full maturity. Nothing could be further from the truth.

First, discipleship is not a program with a graduation ceremony. Discipleship is a lifetime investment. Although the disciple-makers may move on to invest in other people, the disciples should always know that their mentors are available to them for life. Sometimes the most impactful discipleship opportunities occur during late-night phone calls, even if two people haven't been in contact for years. Because of a disciple-makers' past investment in a life, the disciple knows that help and support is available at any time.

Instead of a finish line, discipleship is more like a starting line. It's a place where the process of growing in Christ can be developed then cross the finish line to victory.

For most believers, God supplies multiple lifetime disciple-makers with just the right person to teach them just the right thing and at just the right time. Each person's discipleship is like a new starting line to begin the rest of his or life. Ultimately, every piece of the discipleship puzzle points to one's ultimate place as a disciple of Christ.

So don't sweat it if your disciple can't quote the entire genealogy of Christ, the ten plagues of Egypt, or the twelve tribes of Israel. Instead, work hard to train that disciple to keep running the race.

If Jesus really meant for disciple-makers to teach every detail to their disciples, then the Lord set a poor example for them. By his own admission in John 14:25-26, Jesus explained that there were more things for his disciples to learn that the Holy Spirit would teach while being reminded of things they learned personally from Christ. In other words, Christ did not "teach them everything" in the sense of exhaustive, literal

facts while he was with his disciples on earth.

So what did Jesus mean by "teach them to observe everything I have commanded"? Christ meant for disciple-makers to live by his principle of teaching: To make sure that His disciples were trained in such a way that they would learn all things. In other words, he trained them so they would continue their education under the ministry of the Holy Spirit.

This is just like the old saying, "Give a man a fish and you will feed him for a day, teach a man to fish and you will feed him for a lifetime." Jesus was not satisfied to train his men to be dependent upon his physical presence with them—after all, he would only spend three years with them before ascending to heaven. Instead, he transformed them into self-feeders with "ears to hear" (Matthew 11:15), so that when he was gone, they would be able to learn for themselves from Scripture through the illumination of the Holy Spirit. Disciple-makers must always emphasize Christ's discipleship over their own.

they have no sense of humor and do not have common sense to enjoy the simple things of life.

Consider man's wisdom concerning salvation. In I Corinthians 1, Paul wrote, "For the preaching of the cross is to them that perish foolishness, but unto us which are saved, it is the power of God." God's wisdom says men can receive eternal life from God based upon the death of God the Son on the cross. The central message of the preaching of the cross is SUBSTITUTION. The innocent died for the guilty, paying the debt for the guilty . . . completely . . . 100%. Man's wisdom accepts the cross, but then adds good works, morality, church membership, confession, etc. Men are not saved by what they have done, are currently doing, or promise to do in the future.
