**STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES OR ARTICLES  
OF AGREEMENT**

Section 1. This body when convened shall be known as the Missouri State Association of Landmark Missionary Baptist Churches.

Section 2. The object of this Association is to encourage cooperation and Christian activity among the churches to promote interest in, and encourage missions on a New Testament basis among all people,

to stimulate interest in Christian Literature, and to provide a medium through which the churches may cooperate in these enterprises.

Section 3. This Association, when assembled, shall be composed of messengers duly elected by Baptist Churches that are in sympathy with its doctrines, purposes and work, and of such messengers only. Each church shall be entitled to three messengers.

Section 4. Any church desiring to cooperate with the Association shall send by her messengers or by letter, a petitionary letter, accompanied with satisfactory testimonials of her regularity, order and orthodoxy. All churches must be received by a majority vote. This Association holds the right to withdraw the fellowship from any church she may deem heterodox or risorderly.

Section 5. We believe the Bible to be an all-sufficient rule of faith and practice. There are articles of faith found in different manuals written by Missionary Baptists which are generally believed by our churches.

Section 6. By a Baptist Church in these principles is meant a body of baptized believers in Jesus Christ convened together in the faith and fellowship of the gospel and who hold and teach among other tenets the full essential Deity of Jesus Christ, the full inspiration and authority of the Bible as the written word of God, the absolute necessity of spiritual regeneration, salvation by Grace through faith in the atoning blood of Jesus Christ scriptural baptism and a membership in an orderly orthodox Baptist Church is essential to commune at the Lord's Table.

Section 7. (1) The officers of the Association shall consist of a Moderator, Sssistant Moderator, and Clerk-Treasurer, to be elected at each meeting by private ballot of the messengers.

(2) The duties of these officers shall be such as usually devolve on such officers of a deliberative body.

(3) The Clerk shall act as treasurer of the Association and shall hold all moneys belonging to the Association and pay it out only on direction of the Association.

Section 8. For the purpose of service and information, there shall be a State Missionary Committee composed of one committeeman from each cooperating church in this Association. Each committeeman shall be duly elected for this work by the Church in which he holds membership. On the second day of each annual meeting of the messengers, this committee shall organize by electing a chairman, a secretary-treasuer and an assistant secretary-treasurer. Ten committeemen shall constitute a quorium.

The duties of this committee shall be:

(1) Report annually to the messengers, on the second day of the Association, all finances received and disbursed. Also the work of ~~the~~ missionaries for the year by giving totals, of days on the field—professions of faith—additions to the churches—and churches organized.

(2) Should the necessity arise, the chairman shall call the committee together in special meeting to fill any vacancies among the missionaries which might occur between association meetings.

This committee shall have no control whatsoever over the churches or missionaries, but keep the churches informed of the needs of the field and of the missionaries, and serve the churches as they may direct.

At Associational meetings, men who have been or may be indorsed annually by their respective churches shall be nominated and selected by the messengers for State Mission work.

Section 9. This Association shall convene annually on such date, and at such place as the messengers of the cooperative churches may determine when assembled.

Section 10. As an Association of Missionary Baptist Churches we do hereby declare our entire condemnation of conventionism with all that it is and stands for today.

Section 11. This statement of principles may be changed or amended at any annual meeting by a two-thirds vote of the messengers present and voting, providing notice of proposed change be presented on the first day of the annual meeting.

#### **RULES OF DECORUM**

1. The Moderator shall preside at all sessions, decide all points and maintain order.
2. Every session of the Association shall be opened and closed with prayer.
3. Each member wishing to speak shall rise and address the Moderator and shall speak respectfully.
4. All officers of this Association shall be members of this body.
5. Each day's proceedings shall be recorded by the Clerk and be read whenever called for by the body.
6. All questions shall be decided by a majority vote except a change in our articles of cooperation, which must be by a two-thirds majority.
7. In case of necessity the Missionary Committee shall have power to change the place of meeting for any annual session.

#### **PROCEEDINGS OF THE 21ST ANNUAL SESSION OF THE MISSOURI BAPTIST STATE ASSOCIATION**

Opening songs "There'll Be Shouting, I'm Going That Way" Prayer was offered by Bro. Claude Spyers, then the song, "The Son Hath Made Me Free" Remarks by the Moderator C. A. Darst after which he read from 2 Tim. 4 Two committees were appointed at this time and the following were named: Enrollment Fred Burnett, and G. W. Hawthorne.

On the finance C. E. Gibson, J. E. Mason, and Edd Hofmann. Prayer was then offered by Bro. E. C. Endicott then the congregation sang "Some Day." The singing was led by Eld. Ralph Gibson.

The welcome address given by the Pastor Eld. Jimmie Gibson. The response was given in behalf of the congregation by Eld. C. C. Parks. Visitors recognized at this time were the following: Mrs. Rosa Johnson of Coring, Arkansas, and Smalley of the Bethlehem Ass'n. W. T. Cowan of Hopkinsville, Ky. was recognized stating that he was in the organization of the Association at Potosi in 1928.

Bro. Sol Gibson and the Quartette of the First Baptist Church of Galen, Kans. were introduced and called upon to render several numbers.

Time arrived for the Annual Sermon and the speaker Eld. Glenn Fox was introduced. He read from the Scriptures 2 Kings 7:8-9 after which he called upon Bro. Otto Hillis to pray. At the conclusion of the

message Bro. Fox was given the hand of appreciation while the song "There is a Fountain Filled with Blood" was sung.

The Moderator then called to mind that we had time to transact some business before the noon hour. Motion and second that we go into the election of officers. Motion carried.

Motion and second that we suspend all rules concerning the election and proceed by nomination from the floor. Carried. The election resulted in Eld. C. A. Darst Moderator, Assistant to Bro. Darst was Eld. J. F. McClain, Clerk W. S. Gordon, Assistant Glenn W. Fox.

Petitionary letters were called for and there was one coming from Piolet Knob Church. There was a motion and second that we receive the letter and seat the messengers. Carried. A like letter came from the Bethel Baptist Church near Doniphan, Word from Brother Archie Lewis as to the soundness of this church. Motion and second that we receive this church into our fellowship. Carried. Other churches presenting petitionary letters were the following: Lower Doe Run, Antioch at Zion, Mo. There was a motion and second to receive these into our fellowship. The following brethren spoke as to the soundness of these churches: Chas. Dorsett, E. C. Endicott, R. C. Vance, Harry Darst. Motion and second that the Moderator give to these messengers hand of fellowship in behalf of the messenger body. Carried.

Motion and second to adjourn to 1:30 Tuesday afternoon. Carried. Announcements. Dismissed in prayer by Bro. J. H. Hankins.

## TUESDAY AFTERNOON

The song service was opened by Bro. Edd. Greer when he sang the following songs: "Where the Soul never Dies," and "I Will Sing the following songs: "Where the Soul never Dies," and "I Will Sing the Wonderous Story." Prayer by Bro. R. C. Vance, Petitionary letters were then called for and the one coming from Thorfield Church was read, and received into our fellowship on motion and second which passed. Brother Endicott spoke concerning the soundness of the church and the work there.

Reports called for the clerk gave his report and it was adopted by motion and second.

Report on State Missions given by Bro. Claude Spyres of Kansas City. Motion and second that the report of State Missions be adopted. Carried.

Report of the Orphanage fund given by the Treasurer W. S. Gordon and by motion and second the report was adopted.

Report of the Orphanage Committee read by Bro. R. A. Brand Spoken to by Brethren W. S. Gordon, Elias Mitchell Motion and second to adopt the report. Carried.

Motion and second to retain the same committee as of last year, Brethren R. A. Brand, L. H. Owens, and W. S. Gordon, Carried.

Motion and second that the same treasurer W. S. Gordon be retained. Carried.

Motion and second that the same committee as of last year be retained with the addition of Bro. C. A. Darst, Carried.

Bro. J. H. Hankins gave the report on Inter-State and oreign Missions. Motion and second to adopt the report. Spoken to by the following: Bro. E. C. Endicott and Bro. Hankins. Carried.

Request for Bro. Sol Gibson to sing "When He Reach Down for Me." The Moderator called for a moment of silent prayer in behalf of Bro. E. C. Endicott who was called away on the account of a death that occurred in the work at Springfield, Missouri. The prayer was concluded by Bro. Harry Darst.

Report on B. T. C. given by Bro. J. W. Gibson of Jackson, Mo. Motion and second to adopt report. Carried.

Report on Christian literature and education given. Motion and second to adopt the report as given. Carried.

The report of the special education meeting given by W. S. Gordon and C. A. Darst and others. The purpose of the meeting was to get under way the establishment of a school for our preachers and workers.

Motion and second that the school which has been established become the property of the churches composing the Missouri Baptist Association. Motion carried.

Motion and second that the Moderator appoint a committee to bring up recommendation concerning the government of the school. Carried and the committee was appointed. Those that were appointed were the following:

Motion and second that State Missions be a special order of business following the devotional Wednesday morning. Carried .

Motion and second that we have 1250 copies of the minutes printed and that the clerk be paid \$40.00 for his work. Carried.

Motion and second that we go into the selection of a place for the next annual meeting. Carried. Galena, Kansas was selected by the messenger body.

Motion and second that we go into the selection of someone to preach the Annual sermon. Bro. R. A. Brand was elected to bring the Annual sermon and there was a motion and second that Bro. Ossag be the alternate. Carried.

Announcements stating that Bro. Claude Spires would bring the devotional for the evening service and that Bro. J. C. South President of the Missouri Bible School would bring the message for the evening hour.

Dismissed by Bro. Earl Owens of Poplar Bluff.

Motion and second that we take a free will offering for the MISSOURI MISSIONARY BAPTIST. Carried. Offering \$109.58. Song: "I'm Redeemed" Quartette from Kansas sang. Announcements.

Song service led by Bro. John Gibson. "Jesus Hold My Hand" was sung. Prayer by Bro. W. Henson after which the song "I'll meet you in the morning." Prayer was then offered by Bro. Glenn W. Fox.

Reports were called for and Bro. Jesse Rayfield gave the treasurer's for State Missions. Motion and second that we adopt the report of the State Mission Treasurer. Carried.

Report of the old Missionary Committee given to the Body by Bro. Rayfield. Carried.

Report of State Missionaries called for and Bro. J. L. Britton gave his report. There was a motion and second to accept the report. Carried.

Bro. H. W. Darst gave a very interesting report of his activities in Kansas City. Motion and second that we adopt the report of Bro. Darst. Carried.

Bro. R. W. Vance gave his report. Motion and second to adopt the report. Carried.

Motion and second to adopt the report of R. P. Mitchell who could not be present but sent a written report. Carried.

Motion and second to reconsider the phase of the old Missionary Committee concerning the salary. Carried.

Motion and second to adopt the report by raising the salary to \$8:00 per day. Carried.

Motion and second to adopt the report as ammended. Carried.

Motion and second that we go into the selection of Missionaries.. Carried.

Motion and second that we select four full time missonaries. Carried. Those elected to serve the churches were the following. Brethen J. W. Gibson part time, J. L. Britton full time, R. R. Brown part time, Harry Darst full time, C. E. Gibson was elected by motion and second for full time. Carried.

By motion and second we went into the selection of a Mission Treasurer. Bro. Jesse Rayfield was the choice of the Body.

Motion and second that the Missionaries be asked to make a report of their work to our state paper at least once per month. Carried

Report of the committee to bring recommendations for the government of the school was called for. Recommendations read and adopted by motion and second. Report of the Temporary Treasurer of the Missouri Baptist Bible school Bro. Bishop was read and adopted by motion and second which carried.

Time arrived for the preaching hour. Song by J. H. Gibson "This is My Story" prayer by J. H. Gibson.

Moderator introduced Eld. C. C. Bishop for the message of the hour. Bro. Bishop read from Exodus 25:21-22, Subject "I Will Meet Thee." After preaching the message the song "How Firm a Foundation" was sung and he was given the hand of appreciation.

Motion and second that we adjourn to 1:30. Carried.

Dismissed in prayer by Bro. Hawthorne.

### WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

Special singing. The Galena Quartette rendered several numbers. J. W. Gibson led the singing and following this feature the New Missionary Committee reported.

Report of the finance committee. Motion and second to adopt the report as given. Carried.

Condition and standing of the State Paper, THE MISSOURI MISSIONARY BAPTIST was given by the retiring Editor, C. C. Bishop. There was reported an indebttness still of \$56.64. A motion and second to ammend the report by paying off the indebttness in a freewill offering. Carried.

Motion and second that we vote Bro. C. C. Bishop a life time subscription to the MISSOURI MISSIONARY BAPTIST. Carried.

Motion and second that we go into the election of an editor and business manager for the paper. Carried.

Those elected to serve as officers of the paper were the following: Eld. C. A. Darst, Editor, and Eld. W. S. Gordon, Ass't. Both brethen

accepted the position. Motion and second that we go into the election of a new Publication Committee. Carried. The following were elected to serve on this committee: Jimmie Gibson, C. A. Darst, J. V. Fox, C. C. Parks, Harry Darst, Ralph Brand, Claude Spires.

Motion and second that the Editors salary be the same as last year. Carried.

The new Missionary Committee report was given and a motion and second passed to approve the oral report. The Clerk was asked to record the written report.

Motion and second that the report of the resolution Committee be recorded as adopted. Carried.

Motion to ammend this motion by expressing our appreciation to the Quartette of the First Baptist Church of Galena, Kans. Carried.

Motion to adjourn to meet on Tuesday before the first Sunday in November with the First Baptist Church of Galena, Kansas. Carried.

### RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE MISSOURI BAPTIST BIBLE SCHOOL

Elder J. C. South was elected Moderator of the Committee and Elder Glenn W. Fox was clerk.

By motion and second there was a recommendation asking each church to elect one messenger to serve as trustee of the new institution. Carried.

There was a motion and second to reecommend that ten of these trustees must meet togethr to form a quorum. Carried.

By motion and second that section 6 of the 1947 minutes on page 2 of the MISSOURI BAPTIST ASS'N. be the basic principle of the teaching of this school. Section 6 reads: "By a Baptist Church in these principles is meant a body of baptized believers in Jesus Christ con-enanted together in the faith and fellowship of the gospel and who hold and teach among other tenets the full essential Deity of Jesus Christ, the full inspiration and authority of the Bible as the written word of God, the absolute necessity of spiritual regeneration, salvation by Grace through faith in the atoning blood of Jesus Christ, scriptural baptism and a membership in an orderly orthodox Baptist Church is essential to commune at the Lord's Table."



By motion and second that these trustees be given authority to:

1. Install and replace teachers.
2. Select a president for the school.
3. Determine the salary for the teaching staff, and president.
4. Act as guardian of all properties accruing to the school.

Motion and second carried.

5. Determine the place of meeting of the school.

Motion and second that we further recommend to the Ass'n. that the Bible be made the chief text book of our school.

Motion to recommend that Bro. South be invested with the authority for one year to call a meeting of one messenger from each church in case of emergency. Carried.

Motion and second to recommend that Bro. Eddie Jenkins act as treasurer for the school. Carried.

Motion to recommend that any person or church having any useful and suitable books for that purpose present them to the school for the establishment of a permanent library. Carried.

Motion and second to recommend that the first regular meeting of the trustees be at the State B. T. C. fellowship meeting at Poplar Bluff in June, 1949. Carried.

Motion and second to adjourn. Carried.

We further recommend that all cooperating churches of the Missouri Missionary Baptist Ass'n. get behind all Missionaries elected with their moral, financial, and spiritual support.
