

It's Camp Time! Are You Ready?

You only have a few days to complete the adult screening. Don't forget to go over the camp rules with your group. Double check your packing list. Bible, Clothes, Toiletries, Sheet, pillow, light jacket, flashlight, canteen money, ear plugs, muzzles, straight jackets. You know, all the essentials.

As of this writing the camp fund is around \$12,000.00. We should have just enough funds to cover camp week. However at this time we still owe \$15,000 on the loan from last year. I'd like to encourage you to bring special funds with you to camp to specifically help pay down that loan debt.

- Charleston Baptist camp \$80 to cover camp week expenses. All maintenance, repairs and upgrades are paid by the SBC association.
- And then there's Eagle Sky Christian Camp in Piedmont MO. \$425 for food and bed, and activities cost extra.

Considering these options we are blessed to offer a "free" camp experience. We all know it's not free, but we don't require payment we only suggest campers help us with expenses. Most do but some can't. With our current setup no one is turned away. Will you ask your church and campers to help us catch up on our finances?



10/40 Window

If you were going to partner with a gospel missions effort to reach as many with the gospel as possible, where would you begin? If you could locate a place on the map where millions and millions of people live in a very concentrated area, where two-thirds of the world's population live on just one-third of the earth's land mass, would that seem like a logical place to focus your efforts? There is a place that matches that description. It's called the 10/40 window.

The 10/40 Window (10 and 40 degrees north latitude) is where nearly 2/3 of the world's population, almost 4 billion people, is located. It represents the heart of the Islamic, Hindu, Buddhist, Animist and Atheist religions of the world. The people living there have very little or no access to any Chris-



tian resources. In fact, most of the governments residing in the 10/40 window are hostile to Christianity.

Baptist Medical Missions International (BMMI) has been led of the Lord to focus our ministry efforts working with BMA Missionaries to reach the people in the 10/40 Window. By taking much-needed medical care to the underserved people living in the 10/40 window, BMMI is opening doors for BMA Missionaries to plant new churches and make new disciples for Christ.

The average cost of caring for a patient in a BMMI Clinic is approximately \$20. That \$20 can change a person's eternal destiny. That \$20 makes it possible for a BMMI physician to care for a patient, pays for his/her airfare to the field, gives him a modest place to stay, allows for food expense, provides all of the medicines needed, pays for language translators, gives eyeglasses for patients who need them and provides for an evangelistic team to share the love of Jesus with each patient who comes to the clinic. On each BMMI trip there are over 1000 patients who are ministered to. That's 1000 people who are given medical care and introduced to the Good News of Jesus... all for only \$20 per patient.

How can you be a part of BMMI's effort to reach the 10/40 window?

First, please pray daily for the ministry of BMMI.

Second, volunteer to be part of a BMMI team! You don't have to be a medical professional to go on a BMMI Trip! There are many places where you could be a real blessing! Your greatest qualification is a desire to see people come to faith in Jesus.

Finally, help supply medicine, eyeglasses or support someone who has a desire to go on a trip by giving a generous offering to this ministry.

Prayer Concerns

As you know, in the last couple of years there seems to have been an escalation of evil around the world. Attacks on Christians, including the burning of church buildings and mass murders of their members, have dramatically increased in places like Africa, India and the Middle East; yet, most of these go unnoticed and/or unreported by the main stream media.

Likewise, here in the United States we're seeing an allout war against long-held Judeo-Christian beliefs. Although termed a "cultural war," in reality it is a spiritual war, led by the "god of this world" and those whom he has blinded (II Cor. 4:4). It's also further evidence that God has turned many over to "a reprobate (perverse/perverted) mind, which has no fear of Him or His coming Judgment, as it calls 'good' evil and 'evil' good--while also applauding those who join in with them" (Romans. 1:18-32).

None of this is more evident than the current sexual revolution and the support for the LGBTQIA (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer or questioning, intersex and asexual or allied) agenda. And, this belief-system says it's up to an individual to determine if he's "bisexual (attracted to both male and female). . .pansexual (attracted to all gender identities). . . asexual (no sexual attraction). . .demisexual (no sexual attraction unless there's a strong, emotional, romantic connection with someone). . .graysexual (occasional sexual attraction). . .cisgender (one whose gender identity matches the sex they were 'assigned' at birth). . .transgender (one whose gender identity differs from their biological gender at birth). . . gender nonconforming (GNC), nonbinary, genderqueer, intersex or gender fluid, which refuses to be termed masculine or feminine.

Sadly, in an attempt to be more inclusive (and not alienate their customers), many of the world's largest, most recognized corporations are supporting these. Their advertising lauds this "freedom of expression and, in fact, caters to it."

Such is also the case in numerous states where governments and schools are encouraging citizens and students to get on the bandwagon by walking in "Pride Parades." Some cities, like Seattle and Spokane, have even sponsored a drag show at some of their public libraries, which included an open mike, karaoke, presentations on "safer" sex, an "advice panel" and a "breast binder raffle," which helped transgender-identifying females to flatten their breasts so they'll appear more masculine.

And, if that weren't enough, Hollywood is also ramping up its support by pushing the agenda in its cartoons. Recently, the popular PBS program, "Arthur"--which has been a favorite of kids for over 20 years--had an episode, entitled "Mr. Ratburn

What Does The <u>BIBLE</u> Say.... About Recreational Marijuana Use? by Mike Harmon


In some parts of the USA, and in many other parts of the world, governments are decriminalizing/legalizing the use of marijuana, not just for medical use, but for recreational purposes as well. Christians' arguments against marijuana use have traditionally included a submit-to-the government angle, but, of course, where marijuana use is legalized, that aspect is removed from the equation. The question then arises, is it a sin to use marijuana in places where it is legal to do so?

In instances where recreational marijuana use is legal, there are still two primary issues that should keep people form using it. The first is the impact marijuana has on physical health. A recent study by the Journal of Neuroscience demonstrates that even casual marijuana use changes the brain and can lead to mental illness (see USA Today and Journal of Neuroscience). The fact that children are being hospitalized due to accidental marijuana exposure also demonstrates the health risks: <u>MedicalDaily.com</u>.

The health implications are by no means a secret. And the detailed scientific study demonstrating the effects of marijuana use on the brain was probably unheeded. Simple observation demonstrates that marijuana deadens the brain, resulting in laziness and an inability to concentrate or think clearly. The pain relief many receive from marijuana is a result of this brain-deadening effect. So, very similar to using tobacco and abusing alcohol, the recreational use of marijuana should be avoided due to its adverse effect of health. While the context of I Corinthians 6:12-20 is not specifically about harming the body, the clear implication is that we are not to intentionally do things that hurt our bodies.

The second reason to avoid recreational marijuana use is the fact that marijuana is addictive (see Psychology Today and <u>Brown.edu</u>). The Bible commands us not to allow our bodies to become "mastered" by anything. "*Everything is permissible for me --- but not everything is beneficial. Everything is permissible for me --- but I will not be mastered by anything.*" (*I Corinthians 6:12*).

Beyond these two reasons, recreational marijuana use is not consistent with anything the Word of God tells us about the Christian life. We are to be transformed by the renewing of our minds (Romans 12:2), not by the deadening of our minds. We are to be sober-minded about the devil's schemes (I Peter 5:8-9), not so stoned that we don't even care. We are to be filled with the Holy Spirit (Ephesians 5:18), not baked/blasted/ wasted by what is undeniably a harmful drug.

People Can Change

James A. Garfield (1831-1881) was one of the finest men ever elected President of the United States. His reputation for personal integrity, industry and Christian character was considered stellar and never seriously questioned. His Vice President, Chester A. Arthur was thrust upon him without his consent. Arthur was also the polar opposite of Garfield in terms of personal character and respectability.

Chester A. Arthur was the product of, and could have been a poster boy for, corruption in politics. For his lap-dog type loyalty to the political power brokers of his day, he was made collector of the New York Customs House until he was forced out of that office by charges of corruption. He had never been considered to be anything more than a puppet and henchman for a powerful New York Senator named Roscoe Conkling. Arthur was nothing but a toady to, and a tool of, Conkling's political machine. Before he became Vice President, Arthur did everything he could to help Conkling oppose Garfield's election, and after he became Vice President, he did everything he could to help Conkling obstruct Garfield's presidency.

By the time President Garfield was shot by an assassin, after only a few months in office, Chester A. Arthur, age 52, had a well earned national reputation as an unprincipled, untrustworthy, self-serving political weasel. So much so that he and the rotten political element he represented immediately began to be blamed to one degree or another for what had happened to Garfield. E. L. Godkin, the editor of The Nation, wrote in an editorial: "It is out of this mess of filth that Mr. Arthur will go to the Presidential chair in case of the President's death."

Chester A. Arthur was the kind of man, whom everyone, including himself, would have thought was past redemption and incapable of changing. But he did become, almost over night, a radically changed man. Immediately upon learning that Garfield had been shot, Chester broke down, wept like a child, and remained isolated and emotionally inconsolable during the three months that followed until Garfield died. He was tormented by the disloyalty he had shown the president and by a deep sense of the contrast between Garfield's goodness and his own badness.

Arthur, to everyone's surprise, courageously defied Conklin and the corrupt political machine that he had served so completely throughout his adult life heretofore. Upon Garfield's death, he assumed the presidency with such compassion and commitment that a citizenry that had once despised him would come to love and support him.

The great transformational change in Chester A. Arthur came about as the result of letters he began receiving from a young invalid named Julia Sand; a person unknown to him and living in a distant state. Here are some excerpts from her letters in the order in which they were received by him:

• "The hours of Garfield's life are numbered—before this meets your eye, you may be President. The day he was shot, the thought rose in a thousand minds that you might be the instigator of the foul act. Is not that a humiliation which cuts deeper than any bullet can pierce?"

• "It is not the proof of highest goodness, never to have done wrong, but it is a proof of it ... to recognize the evil, to turn resolutely against it. Once in a while there comes a crisis which renders miracles feasible. The great tidal wave of sorrow which has tolled over the country, has swept you loose from your old moorings, & set you on a mountaintop, alone."

• "Disappoint our fears. Force the nation to have faith in you. Show from the first that you have none but the purest of aims."

In one place noted above, Julia Sand wrote, "Once in a while there comes a crisis which renders miracles feasible." She wrote this against the backdrop of two crisis situations. One crisis involved the taking of Garfield's life, and the other crisis had to do with where Chester A. Arthur's life had taken him. In Arthur's case, a miracle became feasible, and through the intervention of Julia Sand's letters, a miracle took place in his life.

Now, the whole purpose of this article is to remind us of two things:

Number one, that people can change. There are those concerning whom their past record, present behavior or the passing of time may make us think that they are past redemption. But this may very well not be true at all. They may just be Chester Arthurs in need of a Julia Sand.

Secondly, there may be some of us who desperately need to change, and we need to know that we can. Regardless of how poor our character and conduct has been up until now and how long we have been the way we are, we can be changed as dramatically for the rest of our lives as Chester A. Arthur was.

It is only too late for ourselves or others to change for the better if we think it is. It's only too late if we let it be too late. Consider the powerful truth there is in Romans, chapter 12 — truth that can be applied to our own or to someone else's life:

"Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good." Romans 12:21.

"And be not conformed to this world, but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God." Romans 12:2.

Will you be somebody else's Julia Sand? Will you speak truth, honestly and encouragingly to them as to their need to change and the possibility for their changing? Do you need to take encouragement from, and heed her words yourself? "And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." John 8:32 asked 1) Are you concerned about President Donald Trump undermining the rule of law, 2) are you concerned about the American government's harsh treatment of immigrants and their due process, 3) are you concerned about efforts to undermine the Roe vs. Wade abortion law, and 4) are you concerned about President Donald Trump and conservative efforts to deny L.G.B.T.Q. (Lesbians, Gays, Bisexuals, Transgender, Queer) people their fundamental rights, and on and on with 14 detailed questions. They oppose the death penalty, they oppose government preference for religion over non-religion, and the right for L.G.B.T.Q. people to adopt children and babies. Since 1920 they have harshly promoted and sought to enforce separation of church versus state, have taken on court cases in behalf of the Communist Party, and they have a policy in favor of pornographic material about children.
