A Page from My Heart

Most everything we own will outlive us. The question is: will our influence? I am wearing a dead man's shoes. I love the shoes, they are comfortable. But remembering the one I got them from is even more comforting. Jim is a good man. The reason I say this is because he is still as alive as Moses or Abraham. Yet, his time here on earth is done, as mine will be soon.

Dear Christian, what are you doing that will last? Will your influence outlast your possessions and your body? How can we make sure that our influence doesn't fade when our life does? The key is to not make our possessions our focus because they will be somebody else's soon enough. But to make our influence on our loved ones and those that we are called to love our focus.

Does Matthew 28:18-20 guide your life? Are you living each day, each moment for the Gospel's sake? Now you and I know that no one makes 100%, but is it our focus? You see, success is not what we are called to, but obedience is. Every time we fail is an opportunity to start again.

Recently, we as a people (Christianity) have been dealt a punch in the gut with the revelations of Ravi Zacharias and his moral failings. Many of us who were blessed, encouraged, and instructed by his teachings have struggled with how to answer people on the fallout. A friend of mine that we sharpen each other through text for the gospel's sake, asked me what I thought. This is my answer:

I do not believe that man's flesh negates the Spirit's instruction. Now, does it make it harder for mortal man to stomach it? Well certainly, but that gets us back to the "he who has no sin cast the first stone" discussion. Am I saying that it's no big deal? Absolutely not! It's about the worst-case scenario a Bible teacher could experience, as far as stumbling at the finish line. For those who do not want to believe the difficult truths that the Spirit taught through him, they now have their excuse! And for those of us who want to believe, we have our doubts because of the fragility of someone we thought was the Rock of Gibraltar!

Personally, I believe that everything he taught that is confirmed by the Word is still valid and usable; we just will probably have to leave his name out of it when we quote him, which most likely should be judgment enough. I can only imagine the pain, the grief, shame, doubt, and despair that his wife, children, family, friends, and associates are going through because every one of them knows the validity of the truths that he taught. They know the validity of scripture, and here their crown jewel teacher has marred all of that. Obviously, we can rise above this, but we're going to have to seek the Spirit's healing and navigation through this.

So again, dear Saint, I implore you be obedient to the Gospel and the righteousness that the Gospel demands, and one day soon you will hear your Master say, "well done, thou good and faithful servant, enter thou into your rest." And maybe, just maybe your nephew or niece will gain a possession you once had and remember the influence of a loving uncle or aunt more than the possessions.

Following are a series of announcements made in the Camp Garwood Facebook group last week. After our trip to camp in the snow I had promised the group some big announcements in the following week. My family and I headed to camp for the big snow storm and had a great time. Playing in the snow beats working in it any day. You can see pictures from that trip on the Facebook page if you are interested. Now that winter is officially over we turn our thoughts to Spring. We are looking forward to seeing everyone at camp. As always we ask that you be praying for us, and all the folks that will be working to make camp possible this year.

Big Announcement #1

Camp has purchased this tractor! We have needed to make this upgrade for awhile. We were not really looking at this time but this opportunity came up and the committee and myself thought it was time. However, Now that we have it, we need to pay for it. We have the funds in the account but rather than wiping out the

account we borrowed the money from the loan fund. We will get the old tractor ready to sell along with the implements that we don't need. We will designate all DEWR funds toward the tractor purchase this year. So with that being said, are you a DEWR? A DEWR is anyone who gives \$ 75 annually to camp. That's roughly .20 a day or \$1.50 a week. Will you be a Camp Garwood DEWR?

Camp week in years past cost around \$8000.00 we don't know yet what our food costs will be this year so we are planning for a \$10,000.00 week. And we know there will be some extra repair/replace costs to get camp ready. (Freezer, Slide, Archery, etc.)

The tractor loan is \$17,500.00. This may be too much info. I could simply say, HEY we need money! But I'd rather lay everything out for you.

Not as "BIG" and NOT requesting money. But still huge in importance.

As Spring quickly approaches we are asking groups to adopt a dorm. This will involve a good cleaning, wiping down each bunk and making minor repairs as necessity and ability allows. (Lighting, Toilets, leaking sinks, gutters, painting, cleaning up leaves, etc).

Philemon 7 “For we have great joy and consolation in thy love, because the bowels of the saints are refreshed by thee, brother.”

Philemon was an encourager. He was the kind of Christian other disciples wanted to be around. He was busy with others, not himself. He was focused on others, not himself. Oh how we need more like him in our churches today!

The New Testament is replete with what we would call “men of encouragement.” Luke referenced Barnabas as “Son of Encouragement” in Acts 4.36. Luke also speaks of Barnabas encouraging the young church in Antioch (Acts 11.23).

Paul commented how Stephanas, Fortunatus, and Achaicus refreshed his spirit (1 Corinthians 16.17-18). They too were encouragers to the saints.

Dear Reader, as your fellow believers work with you, where do you think they would place you on an “encourager scale” of 1 to 10? A 10 would place you right up there with Philemon and those like him mentioned in the New Testament.

You do not want to be placed down the scale toward the area of 1, or 2, or 3. At this point on the scale, let’s just say you are not seen by others as an encourager. You do not refresh the hearts of your fellow saints. You have no love that

Gentleness Provides Opportunities

“And the servant of the Lord must not strive: but be gentle unto all men, apt to teach, patient” (II Tim. 2:24).

Paul very strongly stated that the servant of the Lord must not be easily drawn into argument and debate. We must not argue or fight. We must be patient and gentle — teaching God’s Word in meekness. It is not enough just to expose error and refute it, we must also teach positive truths and thus help to establish each other in the faith.

We must be “gentle unto all men” and easy to talk to. We need to remain cool-headed when others would be drawn into a heated debate. We must know when to listen and how to speak with tact and courtesy. The best way to disarm an opponent is by treating him with dignity and respect.

Our number one ministry is to be “apt to teach.” We must carefully seek to instruct even those who oppose us. We are “workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth” (II Tim. 2:15).

Our ever-guiding purpose is not to win arguments but to win souls! We want to see deceived people brought to “repentance to the acknowledging of the truth” (II Tim. 2:25). Repentance is a change of mind. A person recognizes his error and accepts the truth. Understand that true repentance comes through the quiet conviction of the Holy Spirit. Repentance is always God’s work! It will never be gained with hard hitting attacks and impassioned arguments, but when truth is shared in meekness and in love.

This kind of ministry requires patience. We never allow ourselves to become irritable or defensive in dealing with others. We must be thick-skinned and must never allow ourselves to become easily offended by their ridicule, insults or their verbal abuse. We do not hold grudges or nurse resentment. We must be forgiving, “even as God, for Christ’s sake, hath forgiven you” (Ephesians 4:32). Jesus Christ wants every one of us to share the truths of God’s Word and to live Christ-like, obedient lives.

The more we allow Him to conform us to His ideal, the more He will be able to use us to win souls and encourage believers. When we are dedicated and faithful to our calling as the servants of the Lord our Lord’s kingdom cause is advanced and our King is glorified.

brings joy and encouragement to others. Review the conclusion of this letter (verse 25): “The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit.” Let that be your resource for encouraging behavior.

“Poorly Named” Equality Act Passes House

On Feb. 25, the U.S. House of Representatives passed, for the second time, a far-reaching gay and transgender rights proposal that opponents warn would have calamitous effects on freedom of religion and conscience, as well as protections for women, girls and unborn children. The Democratic-controlled House voted 224-206 for the Equality Act, HR 5, which would add “sexual orientation” and “gender identity” to the classifications protected in federal civil rights law. “Sexual orientation” includes homosexuality, bisexuality and pansexuality, while “gender identity” refers to the way a person perceives himself regardless of his biology at birth. Three Republicans voted with all the Democrats in support of the legislation. President Biden has endorsed the bill, but the measure will face difficulty in the Senate, where supporters will need 60 votes to overcome an expected filibuster.

The Equality Act would be the most pro-abortion bill ever passed by Congress. HR 5 would redefine the term “sex” to also include “pregnancy, childbirth or a related medical condition.” This language would roll back federal law that protects the consciences of pro-life nurses and physicians who object to participating in abortions because of their deeply held religious or moral beliefs. These conscience protections carry decades of bipartisan consensus — a consensus that no person should be compelled to participate in an act they believe to be gravely immoral. H.R. 5 would also jeopardize the long-standing Hyde Amendment that protects federal taxpayer dollars from funding abortion. There is nothing equalizing about forcing Americans to fund abortion through taxpayer dollars. (baptistpress.com)

New Movie “Roe v. Wade”

The long-awaited “Roe v. Wade” film, which tells the backstory behind the infamous U.S. Supreme Court abortion ruling, is coming out in April. On Feb. 26, the film premiered at Conservative Political Action Conference (CPAC) in Orlando, Florida with producer Nick Loeb and Academy Award-winning actor Jon Voight, The Federalist reports. In April, it will be available online through Amazon Prime and iTunes. The movie tells the true story of the lies and manipulations used to push abortion on America. It is a project of Loeb and Cathy Allyn.

The film follows key advocates in the abortion fight in the 1970s, including former abortionist Dr. Bernard Nathanson and Betty Friedan on the pro-abortion side and Dr. Mildred Jefferson, the first African American woman to graduate from Harvard Medical School, on the pro-life side. The film exposes the lies and manipulative tactics of abortion activists, people like McCorvey and Nathanson who later had a change of heart and dedicated pro-life advocates like Jefferson who fought valiantly to defend the right to life for babies in the womb.

Stan & Donna Scroggins Back in The Philippines

After almost 11 months, we are finally back in Manila. Just before our departure date God threw us a curve — the 150-year ice and snowstorm. It closed down the airport in Tyler, Texas, so we had to rent a car and drive to Dallas to meet our flight to San Francisco. After spending the night in Dallas, we boarded the first leg of our trip.

We were put through the wringer here. After three hours of haggling, and begging, all to no avail, we were denied. Devastating! I was missing one little slip of paper which was a receipt for my visa stamp. (Don’t mention the fact that I had the visa stamped in my passport with the amount it cost written in.) Donna had hers, I couldn’t find mine. Now it was almost 11 p.m. and the flight had departed and we were stuck in a hotel on Saturday night to wait for the Philippine Consulate in San Francisco to open on Monday so we can see if things can be worked out before the next flight to the Philippines on Saturday, Feb. 24 — four days away! If not, we would have to abort as our visas were to expire March 2.

Between Philippine Airlines and our Visa lawyer in Manila, by Wednesday things got worked out and we are finally on the plane. And yes, we had to wear face mask and shields during the entire 14-hour flight to Manila.

We arrived in Manila at 4:30 a.m. and it took two hours to go through all the regulations and procedures — orientation lecture, temperature taking, Traze verification (so they can know you don’t break quarantine), pay for COVID-19 test, get hotel verification, get transportation to hotel verification, go through passport and immigration control (talk about being nervous), pick up luggage, go through customs, walk out of the airport and drive to our quarantine hotel.

We arrived at our home away from home for the next 10 days of quarantine. We can’t leave our room for 10 days until we receive our health clearance card. None of the hotel amenities are available. Food is brought to our room for each meal. On March 3, nurses from Detoxicare came to administer the COVID-19 test, then we waited for two more days for the results to come back. We made it back by the “skin of our teeth.”

There is a ministry here led by Catherine Torrente called Christian Missionary Services. They have been coordinating missionary immigration issues all the way back to when the Moore’s were missionaries here. So, they picked up our passports to begin the visa renewal process.

Now Donna and I had to spend a week hanging out in our room, teaching our Bible College classes online and watching a lot of YouTube videos. We will look forward to reporting next month from our house in Talisay City on our island — Negros Occidental.

World Mission Day in the Philippines

This is the fourth year we have coordinated World Mission Day in the Philippines with the United States. Thanks to John Rey Vallejera (Pastor JoJo), this year’s event was a great success. Donna and I helped encourage student participation virtually, and on World Mission Day there were over 250 in attendance with over 26,000 pesos raised for missions (that’s over \$250, it just sounds more impressive in Philippine Peso).

Contrasts Between Adam & Christ

Romans 5:12-21

The repetition of the word "one" points out a contrast in our identification with Adam and Christ. The phrase "much more" means that in Christ the believer gains much more than we ever lost in Adam.

By one man, Adam; all of humanity came under the consequences of sin, death. Is it fair for God to condemn all of humanity because of the disobedience of one man? The answer is found in the logic that Adam is the head of the human race. Each of us is racially connected to Adam, therefore: his sin affects all of mankind. We need to accept the fact that Adam's one act of disobedience made all of us sinners. Romans 3:23, "For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God."

In contrast Christ, by His obedience on the cross, brought in righteousness and justification. Christ not only undid all the damage of Adam's sin, but He accomplished "much more" by providing a way for mankind to be forgiven of sin. II Corinthians 5:17, "Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new."

Universal condemnation or death for all of humanity was the result of Adam's sin, but because of Christ's obedience, grace flourishes so that all humanity can experience an abundant spiritual life. Jesus gives eternal life abundantly to all who trust Him. Adam's sin resulted in condemnation for all humanity, whereas Christ's substitutionary death made possible life-giving justification to all who believe. Sin can never exceed the grace provided by God, sin loses its threat when compared to the super abounding grace of God.

The contrast between Adam and Christ shows that Adam was tested in the garden, surrounded by beauty and love; Jesus was tempted in the wilderness and He died on a cruel cross surrounded by hatred and ugliness. Adam became a sinner and was cast out of the garden, but Jesus Christ turned to the thief and said, "Today shalt thou be with me in paradise." Luke 23:43 The one sin of Adam resulted in all of humanity being condemned; the one act of obedience of Christ, death on the cross, made it possible for the sinners to be forgiven. By condemning all of humanity through one man (Adam), God is able to save humanity through one Man (Jesus Christ).

The Character of Rugged Men

There are certain traits we think of when we think of rugged men. While there are many, I've boiled it down to three that I think specifically characterize rugged masculinity.

1. Avoid making excuses (Have a teachable spirit)

People have been making excuses for their behavior since the beginning when Adam blamed God for giving him a wife that fell into sin and then blamed his wife for tempting him into it too. (Genesis 3:12) A logic problem seems to exist among those that make excuses- the existence of excuses and teachability in the same mind at the same time. These things seem contradictory to each other. A wise man hears truth, learns it, and changes his ways.

Proverbs 9:9 "Give instruction to a wise man, and he will be yet wiser: teach a just man, and he will increase in learning."

A foolish man however, can't learn because as long as excuses exists he sees no need to learn the thing. So long as he does not need the information, he will not apply it. And

excuse-making says, "I'm already doing everything right, my problems aren't my fault, so I don't need this information."

Proverbs 12:1 "Whoso loveth instruction loveth knowledge: but he that hateth reproof is brutish." (read: stupid)

Some of the most common excuses are, "It's my situation," or "It's others' fault" or "It's God's fault". So long as a man makes these excuses for poor behavior or habits, he is not being honest. Worse, it makes him look weak.

2.) Ignore inaccurate affirmations (Have a humble spirit)

Similar to making excuses, is that of making inaccurate personal affirmations. While excuses say, "My character problems are the fault of something else," inaccurate personal affirmations say, "What character problems? No problems here."

Some common replies in this scenario are "I already do the right things but they're not effective", to which I say, "Is it possible that maybe you're not really doing the right things?" Maybe there really is a character problem and you're not tending to it because it hurts to much to admit that your worldview is flawed.

Romans 12:16b says, "Be not wise in your own conceits." In other words, I must not affirm things about myself that are not accurate. Naturally, we tend to do that (Jeremiah 17:9).

To be Christian men, we must have a source outside ourselves, wiser than ourselves to mentor us. Primarily, this is the Scriptures, so we must study them and see how they desire to change us. Secondly, this may be a personal mentor who is already at a level of Christian maturity that you'd like to be at yourself. A peer (one already like you) can't logically serve as mentor. So study the Scriptures regarding virtue and character, and find a wise mentor to help keep you accountable and moving forward. All of this keeps us from becoming "Know-it-

3.) Reject Complaining (Have a grateful spirit)

1 Thessalonians 5:18 teaches us that God's will is for us to give thanks in everything. How is this possible? As Christian men, we must frequently acknowledge that even on our worst days, we are better off than if we got what we really deserve. What we deserve is an eternity in Hell from which God has spared us by His grace through personal faith in Jesus Christ for salvation. If this doesn't make sense to you, read this.

Philippians 2:14 teaches us to "do all things without murmurings..." (complaints). It is pride that tells us "I deserve better than this." It is envy that says "Everyone else has this but I don't... and I should!" Neither of those, are wise or attractive traits in Christian men. Neither of those make you look competent, confident, or wise. Gratitude however, changes you. It keeps you from complaining. It makes you seem, well, like a man!

These three things: avoiding excuses, ignoring inaccurate personal affirmations, and rejecting complaining lay a good foundation on which you can begin to undo poor habits of character and replace them with good and godly ones.

While these things are for men and women alike, it is these traits that specifically form the picture rugged masculinity- the strong, soft-spoken, confident, competent, gracious man.

What a difficult and different approach to governmental authority. Even if we disagree, we are to pray for those who rule the daily affairs of our lives.

The early church had been accused of action against the decrees of Caesar and having another king, Jesus Himself (Acts 17:7). Their enemies effectively accused them of dissatisfaction with the ruling parties. Paul encouraged these early believers to look to God as the One who had placed these men in authority.

Pray that they would have wisdom. This was Solomon's prayer as he ruled the nation of Israel - that he would have "an understanding mind to govern the people" (1 Kings 3:9). Pray that our leaders would have wisdom to know right and the strength to do it.

Pray that they would have discernment. This is the ability to know right from wrong; to know God's leading as opposed to the leading of the enemy (1 Kings 3:9). Pray that God would protect them from lies and deception.

Pray that they would be instruments of God. This was Paul's instruction in Romans 13:4; that rulers, authorities, and governing bodies were actually "servants of God." Pray that our leaders would lead a society marked by tranquility, godliness, and dignity.

Oh, how we need all Christian folk to rise up in prayer. God can and will hear us as we pray!

good he is to blame. If he is in a smiling mood he is frivolous; if he is serious he is a sore-head. If he seeks advice he is incompetent; if he does not he is bull-headed. If he mixes with the members he is too familiar if he does not he is too ritzy.

So, ashes to ashes, dust to dust; if others won't do it, the Pastor MUST!
