

- New man of peace for Discovery Bible Study, Mauricio. God has been using his Word to change this man's heart, starting with his habits and lifestyle. Now Mr. Roberto is sharing his faith with his neighbors. A week ago, we prepared a gift for Mauricio – a new Bible. Now we are hoping for God's work to do the work on restoring this young man's heart. Praise the Lord His labor is never in vain. As I am typing this update, I just learned that our brother Roberto has been convicted by the Holy Spirit to move to New Orleans to take care of his younger son. His name is Josue, and he is 18 years old. He is deeply involved with wrong crowds leading him to use and abuse of narcotics. God's mercy on his son and each one in brother Roberto's family. His other son's name is Joel. I guess we are sending another missionary to New Orleans. We met brother Roberto in the month of January 2023. - O Obey
- S Store God's Word in your heart through memorization and meditation
- E Evangelize
- R Renew daily

Join us weekly. Pray for us daily. Incorporate these disciplines regularly. It is what He has called us to do!

We also constructed 20 wardrobes to make sure each student would have closet space.

### Minister's Resource Services Name Change

Minister's Resource Services' (MRS) board of directors is pleased to announce its official name change to BMA Financial Services, which will do business as BMA Financial. The new organization comprises the merging of two national agencies—MRS and BMA Foundation—and combines existing financial services provided to the Association into one entity. While the Foundation will remain a separate legal entity, it will now be under the auspices and governance of BMA Financial.

This decision, recommended by both the MRS and BMA Foundation boards, was endorsed by the BMA Coordinating Council and approved by the churches at the 2023 national meeting held in April. The new agency, through its strategic partners, offers our churches financial services encompassing retirement and benefit programs for BMA ministers and employees, benevolent services, risk management insurance, payroll services, Foundation investment management, charitable gift annuities, and financial and estate planning assistance. The new name better reflects the array of services offered.

This change also eliminates the need for two executive directors and two separate boards, thus improving overall efficiency and resulting in better stewardship of the church's resources. The measure should reduce costs while providing economies of scale for the management of the retirement and endowment funds.

"By incorporating these financial services under the BMA Financial umbrella, the organization aims to streamline operations, enhance efficiency, and reduce overhead expenses," said Dr. Steve Crawley, the newly elected Executive Director of BMA Financial. "This consolidation of resources will allow us to better serve our constituents by doing more with less."

The branding process of BMA Financial will come in stages. Plan participants will see gradual changes starting with digital materials including a new website. Until the revamping of the site is completed, www.ministersresourceservices.com will serve as the online access point for BMA Financial.

### ~ Letter from Missions Department ~

Dear churches of the BMA,

We greet you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We pray that God is blessing you and using you to exalt his Son. It is our prayer that God is using you mightily in his mission to make disciples of all nations.

We are writing this letter to inform you of an issue that has come to our attention. Several pastors from Africa, some connected to the BMA and others with no connection at all to the BMA, have been contacting churches, pastors, and individuals directly asking for financial help.

We would like to ask you to please refrain from supporting any of these individuals directly. We are asking this so we may be good stewards of God's money. For instance, one of these individuals asked for money for Bibles, but \$10,000.00 has already been given for Bibles in this region.

Others are asking for money for building projects. We have a program in place to help with these projects: it is called the principle of the thirds. We ask the church to raise one-third of the project, and then we will loan them one-third interest free. Afterward we will gift them one-third from donations from generous church members like yourselves. If funds are given directly to individuals, the program of the thirds will fall apart.

The motivation of the principle of the thirds is twofold. First, we want the churches to take ownership of their own building projects. Second, we hope they will learn that we want to work with them and not for them.

There have been many other requests for funds, ranging from help with medical bills to buying vehicles. Some of these requests may be legitimate, but there is no way to know when they do not come through the proper channels. We already have channels in place for these countries to make their needs known in the United States.

### Where Have We Been?!?

The last couple of months have been packed full of exciting things happening. We would both like to thank the BMA Missionary Care Team for bringing us in for the National Meeting in Conway and the Care Conference in Hot Springs.

The trip to the States enabled us to finalize our permanent work permits. In Zambia, you cannot be in the country while they are being applied for and cannot return until they are fully approved. The last part is something we were not aware of until we landed in Johannesburg on

the way back home. This little fact allowed us to have an unexpected 2-week layover in Johannesburg.

Upon returning to Zambia, it was time to prepare for our 1st team to arrive... in only 5 days! We spent that time collecting the needed supplies for our team project -



constructing the building for our newly planted church, Chabantu Missionary Baptist Church. The team from Temple Baptist Church (Jonesboro, AR; Pastor Andy Neal) arrived and we went to work. We began by digging the holes and footing for the building. It was a great experience for those in the village to work alongside us as we worked to ensure the building would be square. This was a great time for Bro. Andy and me to teach on the importance of The Cornerstone for the church and in our individual lives. The building is not yet completed, but we will update everyone on the progress as it continues. During the team's visit, we were able to have a traditional meal each day with the men from the surrounding villages. For those who had never eaten a traditional village meal, it was quite the experience. I think that 2 of the men survived on peanut butter crackers and beef jerky for the entire week!

On Sunday, Bro. Andy preached from Mark 1:14-15, proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Three of the men we have been praying for stepped forward and prayed to receive salvation!




The brother of the headman of Chibinga also came forward to be baptized after being saved during our Christmas program. We then piled into the back of our trucks and drove many of the church members 5-6

miles to be baptized in a small "lake" used for watering cattle. The ladies from the church sang worship praises in Chitonga the whole way there and back. Once we arrived, we began shooing the cows out of the way so we could bring the crowd to the water. Bro. Andy and Bro. Clinton Morris joined me in the lake to baptize our new brothers in Christ.

One of the last days we were in the village, we utilized the two preachers on the team by having a mini conference. Bro. Andy and Bro. Clinton were able to teach the many who came about The Authority of the Word of God and Evangelism. After the lessons the church presented us with a program as a way of thanking us for all we've done. There was singing by a few men with their

homemade guitar, singing by the children from Bicrof Hope Academy Chibinga, and a skit based off Revelation. Once the program was finished, we began passing out shoes donated by Temple, dresses donated by Round Mountain Baptist Church, and toothbrushes donated by Steve and Michelle Schmidt and Higginbotham Family Dental of Jonesboro, AR.



The day after we returned to Zambia, we were driving to meet up with our translator and the radiator exploded. This week we are searching for a replacement engine. As of this message, we have located one in South Africa and are beginning the negotiations on pricing. Please pray with us that we can get this engine for a good price and that it solves all the issues we have had with our vehicle since purchasing it.

See, the fields are white for harvest.

### The Christian and Patriotism

Can a Christian also be patriotic? If we are "ambassadors for Christ" (2 Corinthians 5:20) and thus "our citizenship is in heaven" (Philippians 3:20), should that limit our sense of patriotism and citizenship here on earth? Do those like the Amish, who refuse to display American flags

and to avow loyalty to an earthly kingdom for fear that it may be at odds with our heavenly citizenship – do they have it right? Are we to be devoid of a sense of national loyalty to our earthly citizenship – in our daily life, and even more so in our worship experience?

While pondering on this question my mind recalls scriptures where the Israelites expressed a lot of nationalism. And at times tones of that nationalism made its way into their (inspired) worship. The Jews routinely recount in their worship the workings of God within individuals and events of their national history. The Psalms are replete with references to God's work in exalting the nation. "The Lord has remembered us; he will bless us; he will bless the house [nation] of Israel" (Psalm 115:12). And as Paul addressed the synagogue in Pisidia (Acts 13:16-17) he said, "Men of Israel and you who fear God, listen. The God of this people Israel chose our fathers and made the people great during their stay in the land of Egypt...."



That begs the question of whether we should be reluctant to do and allow the same.

Of course, any sense of patriotism should never lead us to think we are better than any other nation. And naturally when it comes to nationalism within worship context, we must be cautious about what we emphasize. When we so focus on the nation and its blessings that we eclipse the focus on the One who has blessed us, we've got things out of whack.

Sure, there are ways that no nation can compare with the nation of Israel and God's special workings with her. But even so, I tend to believe that the nationalism in scripture which portrays Israel as a nation blessed by God still can serve as a pattern that allows for a measure of patriotism in our daily life and even in worship as we acknowledge God's blessings upon our great nation.


