Last year Lydia Dunlap went on a mission trip to South America. She wrote about the experience, describing giving out shoeboxes and being asked to teach some of the local kids how to jump rope. After showing them how to swing the rope for themselves, she teamed up with a young mom to swing a longer rope for them to take turns jumping. She went on in her article to describe her feelings on realizing the young mom was actually her age and the differences in their lives because of the cultures they were raised in.

I enjoyed the article very much but it sent my thoughts in a different direction. Thinking about the two girls swinging a rope for the kids to jump gave me a mental picture of how we can work with others too. Each person has a job but on different ends of the rope. You have to work together in a good rhythm to get the right results.

This is a great example of how the WMA can work together with the workers at the Jeevan Prakash School to provide for their students. We can't all go to India to help with this ministry or education of the children. But we can work on our end, doing what we can to keep the rope swinging. If we raise money for the much needed renovations,


there are plenty of laborers in India ready to do the renovations. We will be working together to provide the kids with a safe, comfortable place to learn.

The children are attending school now in a building that needs foundational work to be safer. There is no ventilation for the building that houses all grades. The temperatures in their area often exceed one hundred degrees. The school is unable to provide safe drinking water. Most of us would agree this alone is a dangerous combination. We would not want our own children in this situation.

Those that run the school have stepped out on faith and have begun renovations. Already the lack of adequate restrooms has been addressed. As money comes in they will continue to do any repairs they can without disrupting ongoing classes. The bulk of the construction would need to be done when the school year ends for them in April. Let us try to have our funds in and ready for them to draw from by then. Our hope is that more than enough will come in for the building repairs. The extra can be used to replace the well-worn furniture. New tables and chairs would be such a blessing and brighten up the school. Maybe these renovations and updates will attract more students to the school.

Surely a familiar verse in a situation like this is Ecclesiastes 4:9, "Two are better than one; because they have a good reward for their labor." Over the years we have worked together to raise money for many projects. This year is no different. Let us work together to bless the children and staff of Jeevan Prakash School with a safe and comfortable learning environment. We can do our part in swinging the rope on our end and have faith the Lord will provide someone to swing the other end.

Dear BMAMO Churches,

Well, believe it or not it is February. Before you get this paper we will have celebrated Valentine's Day and probably Presidents' Day, and believe it or not we're almost 10 months away from Christmas 2024.

I know, I know, bite my tongue – but here's the reality: Time stops for no one, and you and I must be busy about the work of the Kingdom.

Two months ago I started a series in this column on Tom Rainer's list of the things that healthy churches do, so today we're tackling item number three: Healthy churches and their leaders hold to the primacy of preaching.

Now certainly this one I believe as BMA churches and more specifically Baptist churches this should be a slam dunk – and I believe it is, certainly within our Missouri churches. Next, the pastor and the church must pray for God to open the hearts and minds of each and every listener and believe that He will do just that.

Next, do not be afraid to make it as simple as possible. Something that the Lord has really gotten across to me recently is that even myself as being someone that knows the gospel and has lived the gospel for all these years, I still am unbelievably and undeniably blessed when I hear someone simply state the gospel from a position of authority. We need to trust the Spirit's moving and using His Word to the glory of God. May the Lord richly bless you as you strive to be faithful to the primacy of preaching the Word of God.

PS: There is arguably so much left on this proverbial table, so please don't think I am limiting this subject as much as trying to hit the high points.

Missionaries to Thailand Brandon and Brittney Lingle have been discipling a young couple, Jay and Ty, who are planting a church seven hours from the capital city of Bangkok where they live. They have a baby daughter and family in the Kantharalak province where they have built relationships in this rural area of Thailand. Jay is currently interning and receiving training to prepare and help with the new church, and the Lingle family will relocate to the area this spring.

The Lingles have served in Thailand ten years, the average time it takes to plant a church there. After building relationships with both Christians and non-Christians, it can be a long road to evangelism and discipleship, even longer to start a church then reach the goal of multiplication.

But God is their guide on this journey, and our missionaries and ChangeMakers "count it all joy."

The Jerry Kidd Missions offering supports these sacrificial servants, and on Sunday, February 25th, you can be part of that multiplication goal.

Africa and South America have several things in common: Most of their countries have emerging economies and are struggling with where they stand politically: Are they socialists or capitalists? But what they have most in common is religion.

Africa and South America Regional Coordinator Johnmichael Poulin says, "While there are many

Catholics, particularly in South America, that's in name only, not in practice. The truth is that both continents are steeped in animistic beliefs. Both include witch doctors, believing they must appease their gods, and trying to find gods they can control. This creates all kinds of barriers to the gospel. But God is faithful and the gospel is breaking through their animistic culture."

BMA Global has a rich history in both continents, South America being one of the first fields the BMA went into. They have established churches and associations and are beginning to send missionaries. But the greatest need is pastors and pastor training, especially in sound theology.

With a large number of Muslims in the Middle East, those who serve this people group are careful not to attack Islam. Doing so only creates barriers to understanding and accepting the gospel. But there is one "language" that breaks those barriers: showing the genuine love and care that Christ had for people during his earthly ministry, love that touches people where they hurt.

So they speak that language to Muslims, even when it's obvious they're attending church and making professions of faith just to receive something in return. Middle East Coordinator Charlie Costa says, "In a volatile area such as the Middle East, our strategy is to stay in the thick and thin of circumstances. We accept war and conflict as one of the realities of the region, and as bad as war is, we also consider it a great opportunity to spread the gospel in times of trouble. Grace has risks and takes risks"

Pray that the Holy Spirit will touch the hearts of Muslims to genuinely

commit their lives to Christ.

Pray that missionaries, ChangeMakers, and churches in the Middle East continue being called to plant the seed, water the seed, then see growth and fruit through the Holy Spirit's work.

Part of our state got snow this week. We might have seen a flake or two but mostly it was just a slushy, cold rain for us. As I watched pictures on the local news station of the beautiful floating crystals drifting down onto the already covered ground, my mind went to the scripture in Isaiah. "Come now, and let us reason together, saith the LORD: though your sins be as scarlet they shall be as white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool." Isaiah 1:18

NEW! White! Clean! That is what we are when we accept the fact that we are helpless sinners and can do nothing about it on our own. We must come to Jesus, repent of our sin, and believe that Jesus Christ came into the world to be the sacrifice needed for our sin and ask Him to save us! That relationship brings us NEW life, a NEW birth, a NEW outlook, purpose, passion. It gives a NEW direction for our life and a NEW love for God and others.

But as with many things in life, there seems to sneak in a fog of apathy...one of passivity that slowly descends on us, causing us to drift away from a close dependency on our Savior. It is time to RE-NEW.

There are many definitions of this word. One means to take up again as with an acquaintance. It means to replenish, revive, reestablish, recover what was lost, to restore to a former state. Do any of those definitions describe what needs to happen in your relationship with the Lord? We know He is always there so we also know the one who must have moved. It's us!

Life gets in the way. Problems arise but we think we can take care of them ourselves. We pridefully try to handle anything and foolishly think we must sign up for everything. All the while we are neglecting the most important thing we need...a close, intimate relationship with Jesus Christ.





On Saturday, January 13, we served 800 meals to the community. By January 20, we felt we had done what we could.


